HONORING SISTER JOHN HAYDEN ON HER 95TH BIRTHDAY AND THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF HER PROFESSION OF VOWS

- Sister John Hayden celebrated her 95th birthday on May 30, 2011. On July 10, 2011, she will also be celebrating the 75th anniversary of her Profession of Vows as a Sister of the Incarnate Word and Blessed Sacrament.

Sister John served her Lord in the field of education for approximately 50 years, with 34 of those years at Sacred Heart Catholic School in Hallettsville. During eighteen of those 34 years, Sister also served as principal. Sister's areas of instruction were physical science, biology, and chemistry, but she was known to fill in for algebra, English, or religion courses when needed.

When asked about her remembrances of her years at Sacred Heart Catholic School, Sister John said that she always accepted the assignments given to her and felt that God blessed her for that. She fondly remembers the love and support of the parents who partnered with the faculty to give their children the best education possible. She is most pleased that the school is still a strong and viable institution in the Catholic Community of Hallettsville.

SACRED HEART CATHOLIC SCHOOL VISION COMMITTEE MEETS – The Sacred Heart Catholic School Vision Committee, formed in 2010, recently met to discuss future needs and plans for enhancing our educational programs. The committee consists of School Advisory Council members, parents, teachers, school administration, pastor, and volunteers.

Short term and long term needs were discussed and plans are being made to meet these needs. The immediate need is to complete phase II of the two upstairs high school classrooms. New floors, windows, and ceilings will be installed this summer, all funded by the grant from the Dickson-Allen Foundation.

A long term plan (2-3 years) is to build a new Advanced Learning Center (ALC) in the immediate south side of the 3rd grade classroom. The ALC would include a library, computer lab, and reading lab for grades K-8. The primary grades (K-4) would move to the present junior high annex and the junior high would move to the present elementary classrooms. The present elementary library would become a primary grade classroom. The classrooms in the junior high annex would be enlarged to accommodate for the increased use of technology, learning centers, and larger classes.

We welcome your input in regards to the vision of where Sacred Heart Catholic School will need to be in 3 years, 5 years, 10 years, and beyond. As our enrollment continues to increase, our needs become greater also.

Enclosed in this newsletter is a Parent Survey. We ask that you complete this survey and return it at registration or mail it by the end of June. In addition, you may write, email, visit, or call the school with your suggestions any time. Thank you for your continued support.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD REPORT – In its 2009 annual report, Planned Parenthood reports its total U.S. abortions increased from 305,310 to 324,008. Its income from the federal government increased from \$349.6 million to \$363 million. Your tax money, which paid for these abortions, accounted for one-third of its total income. 2011-12 FINAL REGISTRATION - Registration for the 2011-12 school year will be held on Tuesday, June 28th and Wednesday, June 29th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and in the evening from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. in the school cafeteria. All high school students must come to finalize their schedules. Parents of students in grades K-8 who have pre-registered will need to come only to pay their fees and first month's tuition.

According to School Advisory Council policy, for a student to be officially enrolled at Sacred Heart Catholic School and participate in extra-curricular activities, as well as for liability insurance reasons, the first month's tuition and all school fees must be paid at the time of registration on June 28th and June 29th. Students will not be allowed to begin football or volleyball practice until these fees have been paid. You may make partial payments in advance at the rectory or school if you so desire.

Please call the school at 798-4251 if you have any questions or concerns regarding registration for the 2011-12 school year. Limited tuition assistance is available. Please see the principal for an application.

Classes will begin at Sacred Heart Catholic School on Wednesday, August 17, 2011.

TUITION AND FEES POLICY

The Sacred Heart Catholic School Advisory Council prior to registration sets the registration fee and tuition for students. A sliding scale for families with more than one child is designed to make a Catholic education possible. When hardship cases are brought to the attention of the principal and/or pastor, financial arrangements can be made.

Since the school must operate on a budgeted month to month basis, tuition must be paid monthly. The Advisory Council has established the following policy for tuition payments:

1. The first month's tuition and school fees are due at the time of registration.
2. Tuition is due by the 10th of each month thereafter.
3. Tuition charges not paid by the 30th of each month are considered delinquent.
4. **It is the responsibility of any parent having problems making payments to contact the principal and/or pastor and complete an Application For Tuition Assistance Form.**
5. Previous years' tuition and school fees will have to be paid before registration will be allowed, unless judged to be a hardship case by the principal and/or pastor, and/or review committee.
6. Failure to comply with the above requirements may result in the following actions by the school:
 - A. Semester/Final exams will not be administered.
 - B. Semester/Final report cards will be withheld.
 - C. **STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN EXTRACURRICULA ACTIVITIES (ATHLETICS, CHEERLEADING, TWIRLERS, ETC.)**
 - D. Student will not be allowed to register for the following school year.
7. All school records (report cards, transcripts, etc.) including graduation, will be withheld until full payment of all fees is made.

CHANGES IN TEXAS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS-On March 5, 2009, the Executive Commissioner on Health & Human Services approved several revisions to the "Immunization Requirements for Children and Students in Texas Public and Private Schools" [Title 25. Health Services, Chapter 97, Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §97.61 and §§97.63-97.77].

The changes to the requirements were made in order to update the Texas elementary and secondary school immunization requirements so that they adhere more closely to the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP). These changes include:

- **Hepatitis A Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN**, STATEWIDE, WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE 2 DOSES OF Hepatitis A vaccine.
- **Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN** will be required to have two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- **Varicella Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **KINDERGARTEN AND 7TH GRADE** will be required to have 2 doses of varicella vaccine. A written statement from a parent (or legal guardian or managing conservator), school nurse, or physician attesting to a child's positive history of varicella disease (chickenpox), or of varicella immunity, is acceptable in lieu of either dose of varicella vaccine.
- **Tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis-containing vaccine (Tdap):** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering the **SEVENTH GRADE** will be required to have one dose of Tdap vaccine. Students in the seventh grade will be required to have a booster dose of Tdap only if it has been five years since their last dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine. Students in grades 8-12 are required to have a booster dose of Tdap if it has been ten years since their previous dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine. Td is acceptable in lieu of Tdap if a contraindication to pertussis exists.
- **Menigococcal Vaccine:** Beginning August 1, 2009, all students entering **7th GRADE** will be required to have one dose of meningococcal vaccine.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING- All volunteers, including chaperones for field trips, clergy, and employees in the Diocese of Victoria are now required to complete the two training sessions the “Code of Pastoral Conduct” and the “Policy Regarding Sexual Abuse of Minors.” All school employees and clergy have been trained.

Any volunteer planning on chaperoning a field trip or any school related trip must first complete the volunteer application and criminal background check. They must then attend the Safe Environment Training sessions. The workshop must be attended within 90 days of the online application/background check completion.

2011-12 SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL- The 2011-12 Sacred Heart Catholic School Advisory Council members are as follows: Christine Haas, Chris Shimek, Carol Rother, Brian Popp, Glenn Steffek and Steven Steffek. The pastor of Sacred Heart Parish is an ex-officio non-voting member. The principal acts as the executive officer of the school advisory council and is also an ex-officio non-voting member. The school advisory council is established by the pastor, in accord with the Victoria Diocesan policy, to assist him and the principal in the governance of Sacred Heart Catholic School.

The school advisory council is consultative in the following sense: The members cannot act apart from the pastor and principal and cannot make decisions binding on the parish school without the approval of the pastor.

The school advisory council meets monthly in the teachers’ workroom, and generally it is the 2nd Monday of each month. The meetings are open to the general public.

2011 “FILL THE SHOES” LENTEN PROJECT – Sacred Heart students and staff participated in the Diocese of Victoria-Office of Catholic Schools Lenten project to raise money to send to Sister Rebecca Janacek so she can buy shoes for children in Kenya, where she is working. Sister Rebecca is a registered nurse who has been ministering to the Pokot people in northwest Kenya since 1987. She is a member of the congregation of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word and Blessed Sacrament in Victoria. Sacred Heart Catholic School students and staff donated a total of \$300.00 for the Shoes for Sister Rebecca’s Children in Africa.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES – OPERATION RICE BOWL – During Lent, the Sacred Heart Catholic School students heard the words of Christ, to pattern their lives more after Him, to repent and believe in the Gospel, to remember others in need around the world. Some chose to PRAY with their families; some selected to FAST with those who are hungry; still others chose to LEARN about the joys and challenges in the lives of people around the world. Many chose to GIVE sacrificial contributions to assist the poor. Thank you to the Pre-K through Grade 10 students and families for assisting others during the Lenten journey by donating approximately \$800.00 to Operation Rice Bowl.

BOX TOPS FOR EDUCATION – Sacred Heart Catholic School recently received a check in the amount of \$706.90 from General Mills Box Tops For Education program which brings our total for this school year to \$995.30. Be sure to save your Box Tops during the summer and bring them in when school starts in August.

FRIENDS FOR CATHOLIC EDUCATION – Grant funds were approved by the Friends for Catholic Education in the amount of \$4,400.00 for the quarterly subsidy and \$2,295.00 for the bus for January, February, and March, for a total of \$6,695.00.
