If sexual abuse by a member of the clergy has occurred in another diocese, the Diocese of Victoria will help bring your concerns to church officials. HEART CATHOLIC SCHOOL NOTIFICATION - Vision and Hearing: Texas law mandates vision and hearing screening for students in EC, PK, K, 01, 03, 05 and 07 as well as students in other grades who are new to Sacred Heart Catholic School or the state. Vision and hearing screenings are conducted throughout the year or within 120 days of a student's enrollment. Parents of students who fail two vision screenings or two hearing screenings will receive a referral letter from the school nurse recommending a more comprehensive exam by an eye doctor, audiologist, or physician. Spinal Screening: Texas law mandates spinal screening for: • Girls will be screened two times, once at age 10 (or fall semester of grade 5) and again at age 12 (or fall semester of grade 7). • Boys will be screened one time at age 13 or 14 (or fall semester of grade 8). The screening takes place in a private environment by certified screeners and/or school nurses. Parents of students who have positive findings will receive a referral letter from the school nurse recommending a more comprehensive exam by a physician. The purpose of spinal screening is to detect the signs of abnormal curves of the spine at their earliest stages so that the need for treatment can be determined. Scoliosis, a common spinal abnormality found in adolescents, is a sideways twisting of the spine. It is usually detected in children between ten and fourteen years of age. Kyphosis, sometimes called round back, is an exaggerated rounding of the upper back and is often confused with poor posture. Many cases of curvature of the spine are mild and require only ongoing observation by a physician when they are first diagnosed. Others can worsen with time as the child grows and require active treatment such as bracing or surgery. Early treatment can prevent the development of a severe deformity, which can affect a person's health and appearance. Acanthosis Nigricans (AN): Texas law mandates this screening for students in grades 01, 03, 05 and 07 in conjunction with the vision and hearing screenings. If an AN marker is noted, the student will have blood pressure, height and weight measured individually in a private setting. Parents of students who have positive findings will receive a referral letter from the school nurse recommending a more comprehensive exam by a physician. The purpose of the screening is to detect a linear, darkened skin color change that usually appears on the back of the neck. This marker is called Acanthosis Nigricans and is caused by too much insulin in the blood. It is a pre-diabetic condition and serves as an indicator of risk for Type 2 diabetes. Acanthosis Nigricans is usually seen during the preadolescent and adolescent years. If you have any questions about screenings or would like to request an exemption, please contact the school nurse.

Parents log into their ParentsWeb account from a bookmark or from a link on our school website or go to FACTSmgt.com. Select Parent Log In and then FACTS Family Online (ParentsWeb) from the dropdown in the upper right hand corner. For first time users only: 1. Log on to www.shschool.org and click on Parent Web button blue button in top right corner. 2. Follow the Create New Parents Web Account instructions. 3. School ID is SACRED-TX. 4. Enter your email address as User Name. (The email address must be the same as the one on file with the school.) 5. Click on New Parent Login. A password will be emailed to the address given. After you have your password, log on to www.shschool.org and click on the Parent Web button. 1. Enter school ID - SACRED-TX. 2. Enter your email address as User Name. 3. Enter the password you received from Renweb. Click Parent Login. Several options will appear. Classroom: allows you to see grades by class and assignments; Student Schedule: lists your child's current classes and times. Click on your choice. All your children will be listed.
