IMPORTANT NOTICES

<u>SAFETY AT HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL GAMES</u> – We want to ensure a safe and pleasant environment at the high school football games and avoid accidents. We ask that young children (those not involved in the actual game) do not play football, or any game involving a ball inside the fenced area of the stadium. Please do not allow your children to bring footballs, etc. to the game. Students are also not allowed to play underneath the bleachers or run up and down the bleachers. All young children are asked to remain in the bleachers unless supervised by an adult. Parents, we need your help in supervising your children. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

TRANSPORTATION CODE FOR WHEN APPROACHING A SCHOOL BUS LOADING OR UNLOADING STUDENTS – Please be reminded that according to Section 545.066 of the Texas Transportation Code, a driver of a vehicle on a road/street/highway, when approaching from either direction a school bus stopped on the road/street/highway to load or unload a student, must stop before reaching the school bus when the bus is operating the red flashing lights. The driver of the vehicle may not proceed until the school bus resumes motion and the red flashing lights are no longer activated. An offense under this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$200 or more than \$1,000, except that the offense is a Class A misdemeanor if the person causes serious bodily injury.

<u>ACTIVITIES</u> – Students will be transported to and from extra-curricular activities by school-provided vehicles (bus) whenever possible. If a parent wishes to transport a child home after an activity is over, the parent must personally sign the child out with the coach, band director, or sponsor of the activity. <u>The child may only be released to the parent and not anyone else, such as a relative</u>. If extraordinary circumstances arise, the principal must be notified by the parent in writing at least two days in advance for approval. (See the Parent/Teacher Handbook – pg. 48)

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

PSAT TESTING: Students in 9th, 10th, and 11th grades will have PSAT testing in October. 9th graders will take the PSAT 8/9 and 10th and 11th graders will take the PSAT. The PSAT is designed to measure the ability to understand and process elements of reading, writing, and mathematics. It is a good preparation for the SAT and the ACT. Testing will be digital this year, in the computer lab, one grade per day. Tentative dates are 9th grade – Oct. 16th; 11th grade – Oct. 18th; 10th grade – Oct. 19th. Students need to get a good night's sleep, eat a healthy breakfast, and be at school on time. Testing will begin after announcements and will be finished by lunch time. There are no make-up dates for the PSAT.

DUAL CREDIT INFORMATIONAL MEETING:

Wednesday, February 7th, at 6:00 p.m., in the Family Center. Any students who are interested in taking dual credit classes are required to attend this meeting. Students or parents who miss this meeting will need to attend the informational meeting held at another school. Students currently taking dual credit classes do not need to attend.
